Step Two: Write the number one on the center-left on the front of the card.

Step Three: Write the term next to the number on the front of the card.

Step Four: Write the definition and its historical significance on the opposite side/back.

Step Five: Repeat **Step Two** through **Step Four** for the remaining required identification terms **numbering them in sequence.**
