

The focus of this project is for you to demonstrate in writing your ability to properly use what you have learned in Spanish this year. You will be graded on the vocabulary you use; it must be equal to or less than your level of learning. For example in English you would not use the word obfuscate unless you were absolutely certain of its meaning and its correct usage. The same is true in Spanish, if you are not absolutely certain of the meaning and correct usage of the word you may not use it in your story. You will also be graded on grammar principles. You must demonstrate proper grammar usage throughout your story; again you may not use grammar principles that you are not familiar with. In this rubric you will be given strict guidelines on the grammar that must be used in your story.

**Determine the subject/title of your story – Sign Up in the Topic Book.**

The story may be on any topic that is suitable for children ages 6 and under. Your story should teach a moral or value. Consider this to be like a parable or a fable. Little Johnny will learn why it is wrong to play with matches, or why he must always tell his mother where he is going. Get creative have fun!

**Layout and Design.**

Your book or story must be illustrated. You must include images that would help tell the story. You will be graded on whether or not the images relate to your story. Your work must be neat and demonstrate effort. You are welcome to use computer clipart or cut pictures from magazines. However all of your stand alone images must have a caption written in English and Spanish. Your story must be written in English and in Spanish. For example: My name is Bob.  
Me llamo Roberto.

The story should be well written, organized and concise. The story must be typed. Use at least a size 12 font. The cover page must include your name, your class period and the title of your story. **The grading sheet from this rubric must be returned with your story!**

**Grading Criteria-** Your grade will be a combination of the scores you receive on each of the areas. See grading chart at the bottom of the page.

**Cover Sheet** - needs to have your name, period and the title of your story.

**Content-** To receive an A, Your story will be well organized and well written to demonstrate mastery of the grammar and vocabulary you have learned in your study of Spanish. Your story will be illustrated with images that help tell the story. Your story will teach a moral or value. A child will be able to read and understand your story. To receive a B, Your story will be well written and easily understood. You will, with few errors, correctly use the grammar and vocabulary that you have learned in your study of Spanish. Your story will be illustrated with images that relate to your topic. Your story will teach a moral or a value. A sympathetic native speaker of Spanish will be able to read and understand your story. To receive a C, You will use the grammar and vocabulary that you have learned in your study of Spanish. Your story will be illustrated with images that relate to your topic. Your story will teach a moral or a value. A bilingual person fluent in both Spanish and English will be able to read and understand your story.

**Spanish Grammar Requirements – Spanish Two-** You will use the appropriate vocabulary to tell your story. You will be graded on spelling including accents. Verbs and Subjects must match. Adjectives must be placed in the proper position relative to the nouns they modify and they must match gender and number of the noun they modify. You must use demonstrative adjectives, descriptive adjectives and possessive adjectives. You must use verbs in the present tense and in the preterit tense. You must use indirect object pronouns and direct object pronouns. You must use the following constructions: Ir + a + infinitive, Para + infinitive. You must use Reflexive Verbs in present tense and the preterit, Stem Change Verbs, Imperfect tense verbs, Reciprocal reflexive verbs, The present progressive, The impersonal “se”, and future tense verbs.

**Oral Presentation-** You will present your story to a group of your classmates. They will give you a grade based on how well they understand what you are trying to say.
